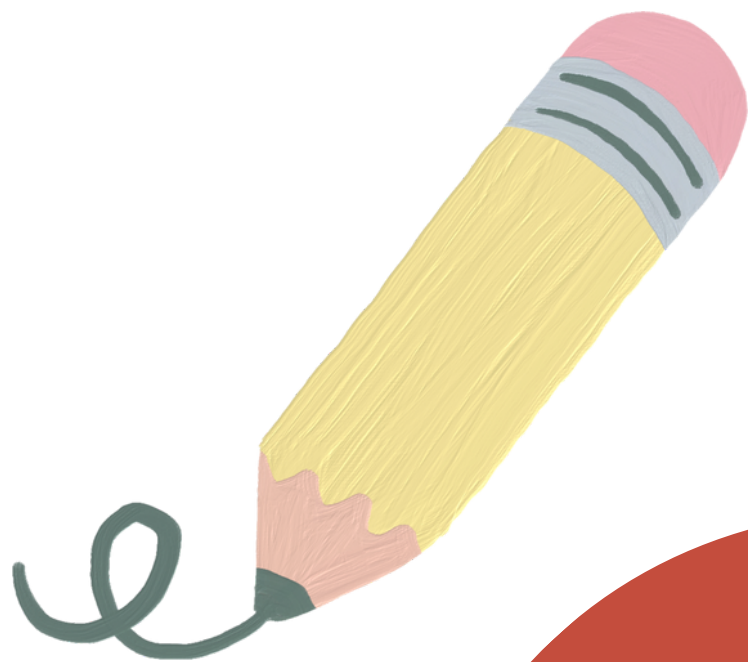

Where is Wales?

Wales has been home to people for thousands of years.

Over time, small kingdoms formed with their own leaders.



St Nons Well was said to have arisen from the birth of Saint David.

Early Welsh Kings

- Some kings helped shape Wales.
- Rhodri Mawr helped defend Welsh kingdoms.
- Hywel Dda created important laws.



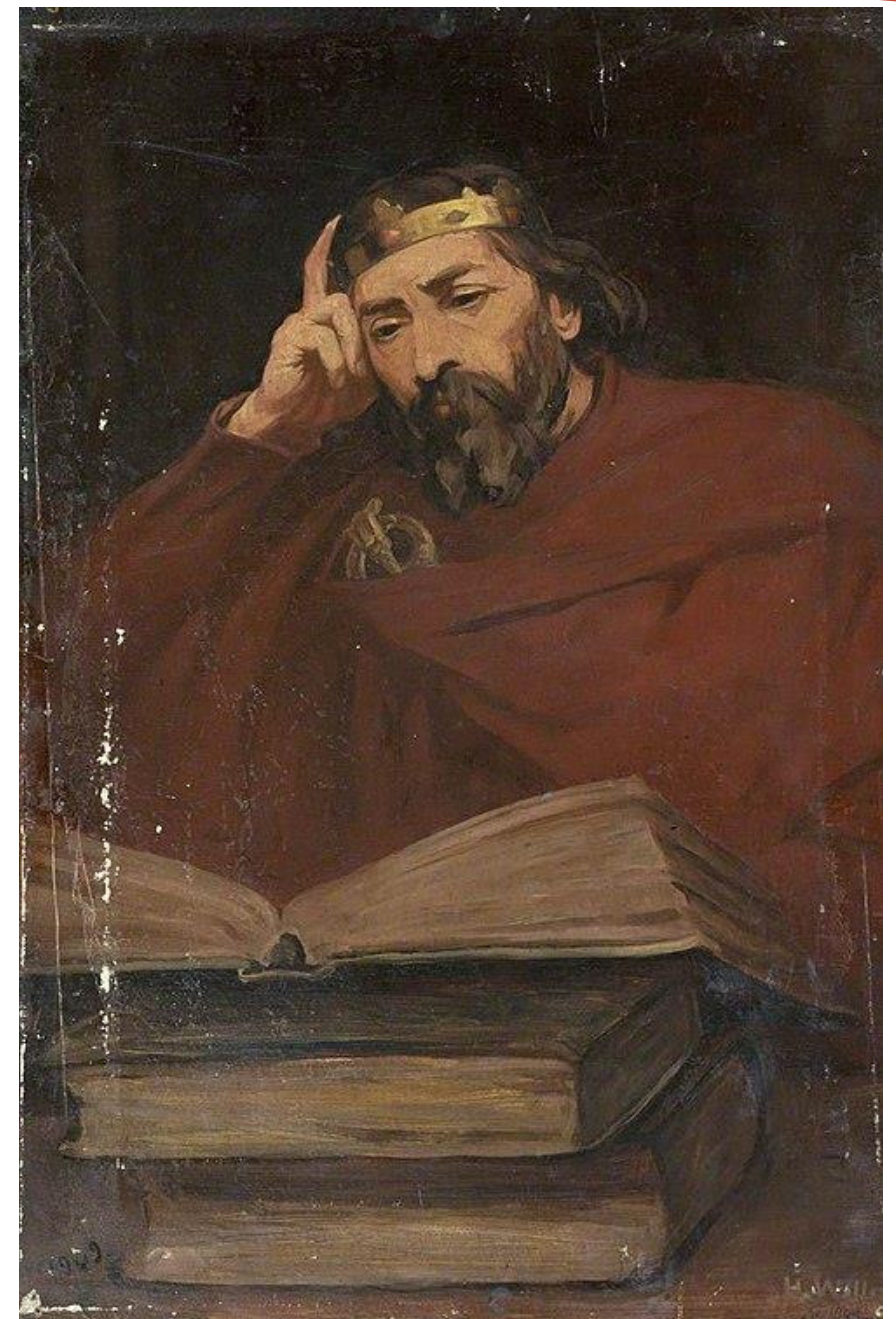

The Laws of Hywel Dda

Hywel Dda made laws to keep peace and fairness.

His laws:

- solved problems with compensation
- protected families
- used witnesses in court

Why this matters ?

These kings and laws helped people begin to think of themselves as Welsh.



Who was Moshoeshoe?

Moshoeshoe was a leader who helped bring Basotho people together.

He created a strong kingdom in the mountains.

Thaba Bosiu

Moshoeshoe moved his people to a mountain called Thaba Bosiu.

The mountain helped protect the community.

A Nation Forms

Moshoeshoe's leadership helped create the Kingdom of Lesotho.

Today he is remembered as the father of the Basotho people.



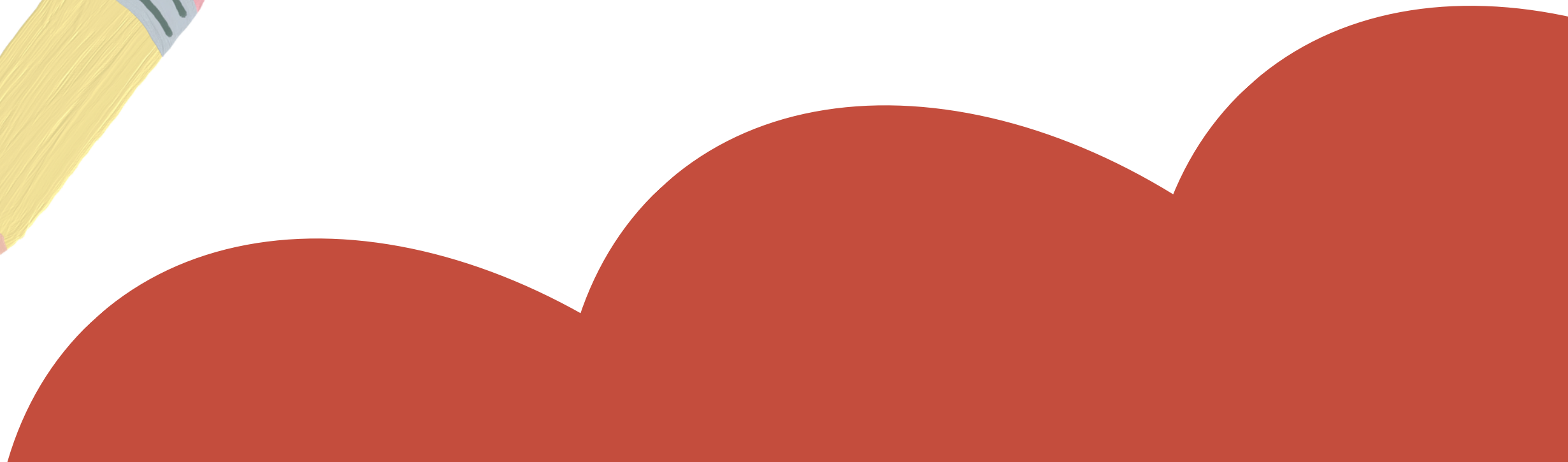
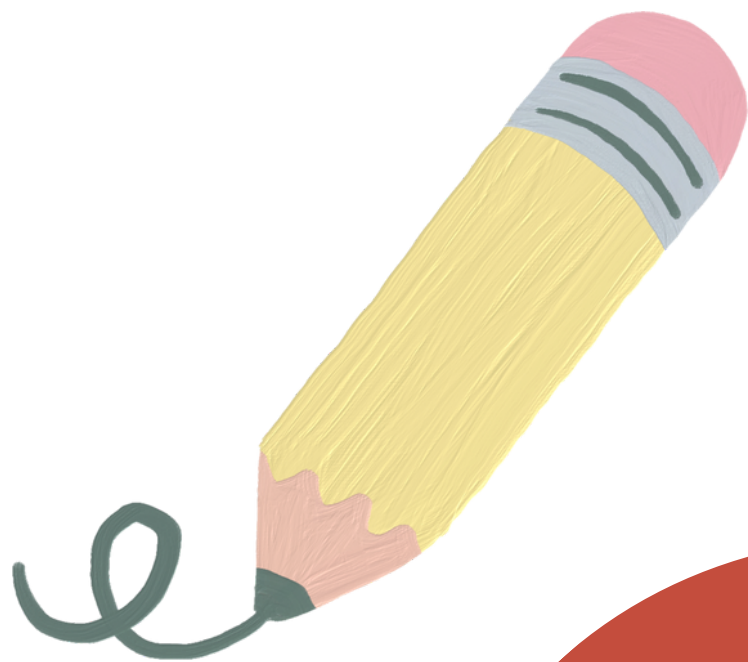
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Food (Wales & Lesotho)

Food and Culture

Food is an important part of culture.

What people eat often depends on:

- climate
- farming
- traditions



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Food in Lesotho

Many Basotho families grow food such

as:

- maize
- beans
- wheat
- vegetables



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Communities sometimes help each other during harvest.



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Traditional Foods in Lesotho

Popular foods include:

- papa (maize meal)
- roasted maize
- samp
- fat cakes



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Food in Wales

Traditional Welsh foods include:

- cawl (lamb stew)
- Welsh cakes
- laverbread
- Glamorgan sausage

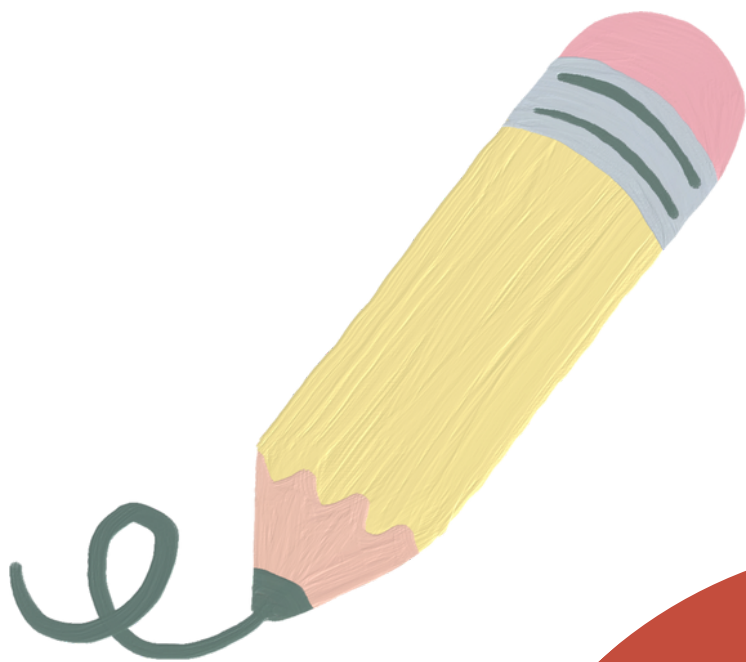




National Dress

What is traditional dress?

Traditional dress is clothing people wear to show:

- culture
- identity
- celebration
- history

Different communities have special clothes for important events.



Basotho Dress

In Lesotho, traditional clothing includes:

- Basotho blanket
- Mokorotlo hat
- Seshoeshoe fabric dresses

In Lesotho, some people wear:

- Basotho blankets
- Mokorotlo hats
- patterned dresses

Dress in Wales

In Wales, traditional dress includes:

- tall black hats
- shawls or cloaks
- long skirts

Clothing and Identity

- warm and thick
- useful in cold mountain weather
- worn by men and women
- sometimes worn at celebrations

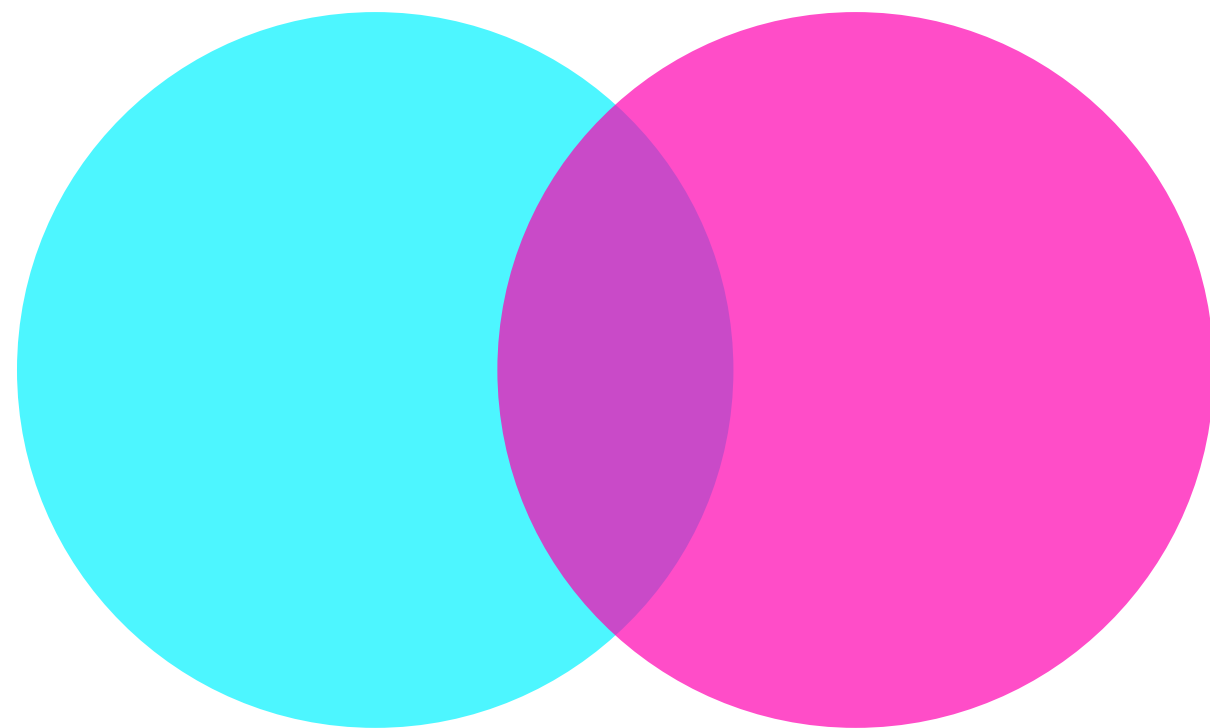

But clothes may look different because of:

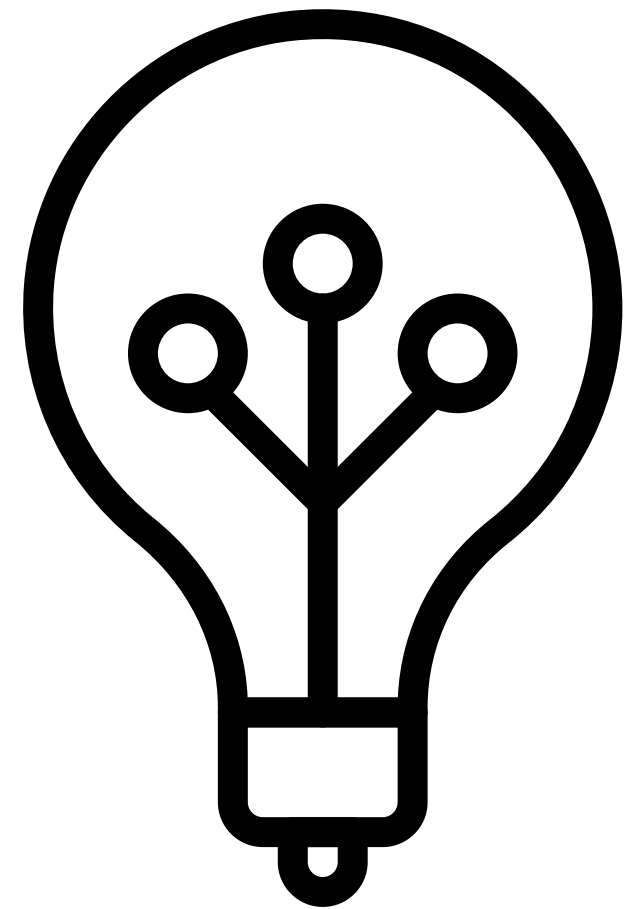

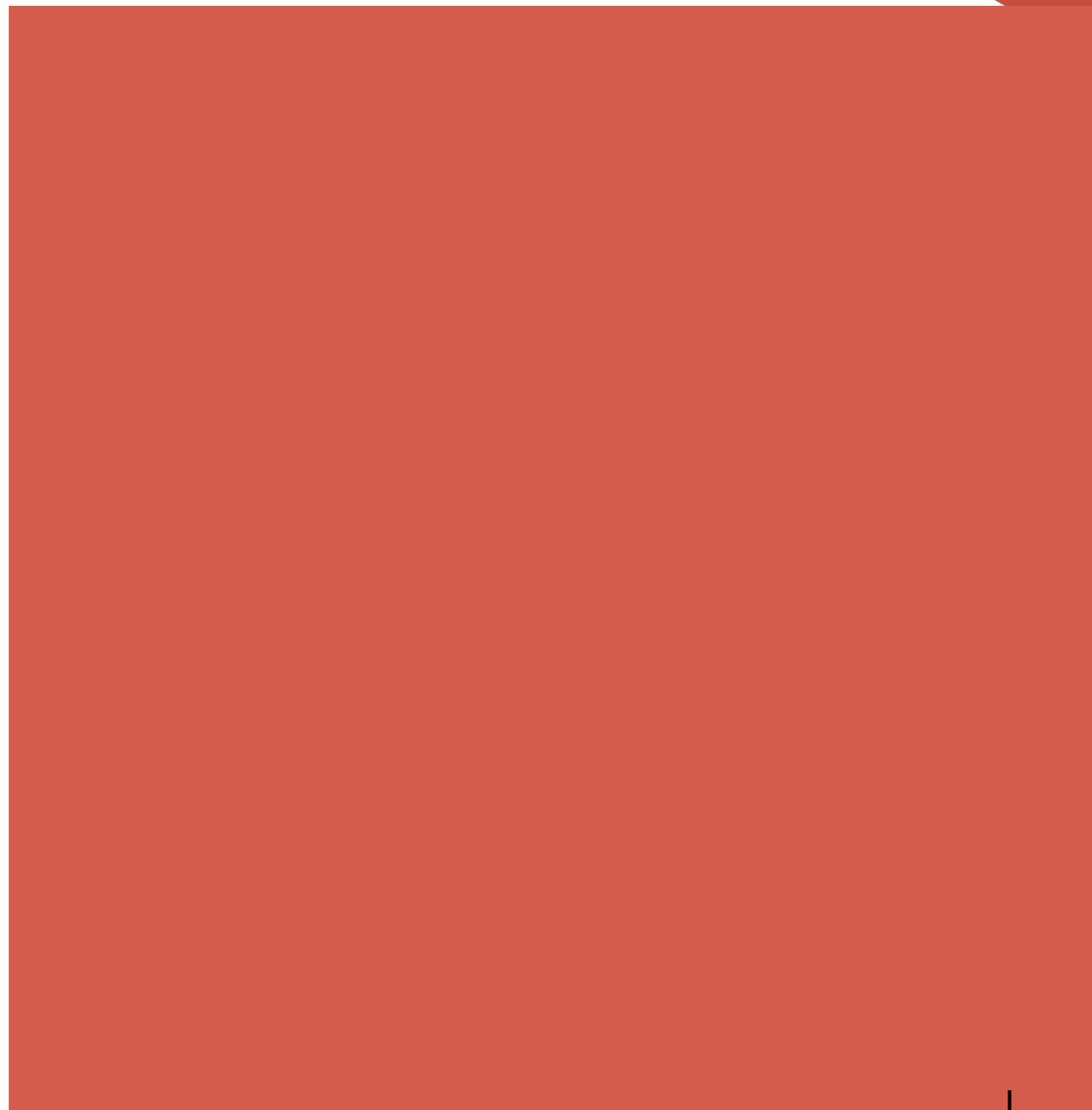

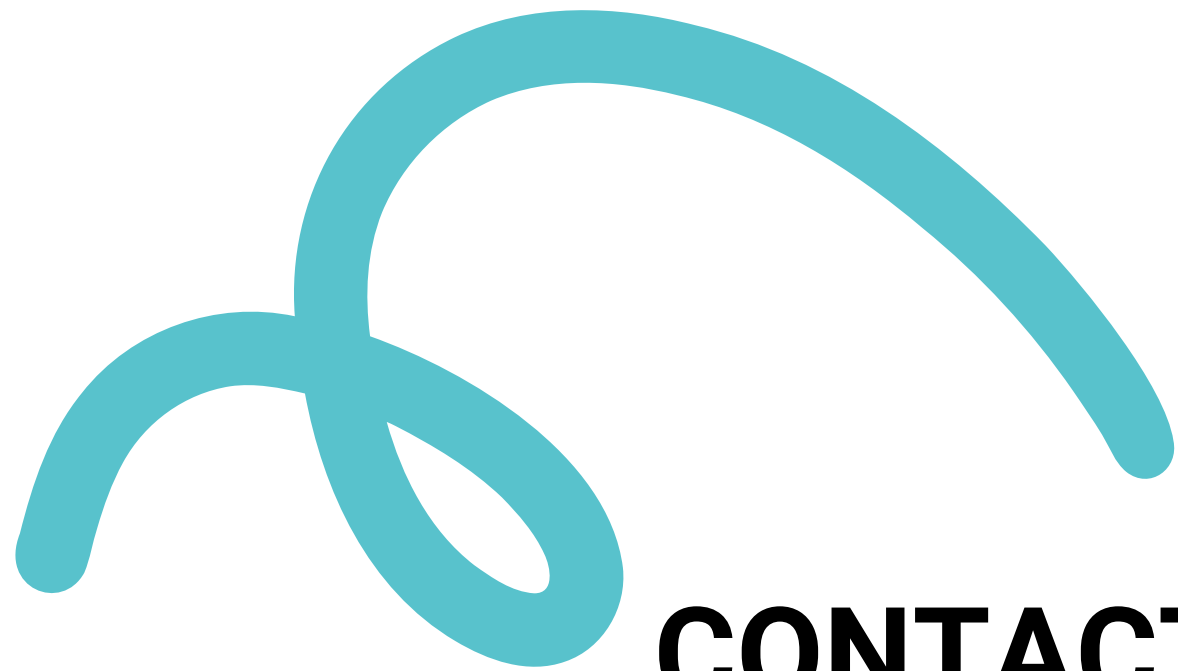
